1. Staff Report: Jack Thomson and Stewart Gray

Mr. Gray introduced Tommy Warlick, the HLC's Consulting Preservation Planner.

2. Discussion of Beatties Ford Road Corridor Survey

Mr. Clarke gave an overview of the Survey and discussed the *Charlotte Agenda* article on the area and the relevance of the Survey. Mr. Gray discussed the webpage interface developed for the Survey.
